- Public Library System Redesign Project Bruce Smith at DPI has been working with the System Director Surveys regarding various aspects of the implementation
- j. ALS Board Report Sarah Strunz HPL's mystery fundraiser format has changed. José reminds everyone to vote. Everything else has been covered.

### 5. New Business

- a. DPI/DHS recommended materials quarantine
  - i. Maribeth Miller: Has since changed her thinking and has started reducing quarantine and changing the dropbox hours
  - ii. Charles Teval: REALM Study was a study, not a recommendation. Looked to Oregon State Library and WI DHS for recommendation based on the results of the study. SHARE's quarantine policy is library by library though a consistent policy is desired by some. Likes a system approach. Thinks book drop and delivery materials need to be quarantined the same.
  - iii. Kirsten Almo: Goal to be consistent among ALS. Patrons watch their accounts when they return things, they'll know if we change quarantine policy. Likes a system approach.
  - iv. Ashlee Kunkel: Less comfortable immediately checking in book drops.
  - v. Nick Dimassis: Thinks we should state we're following the science.
  - vi. Steve Platteter: Most concerned with materials traveling between libraries and systems especially the Racine sorting hub. Racine feels they can safely work with the 24-hour quarantine.
  - vii. Green bins=look at date/time on tape. Can advocate to keep that portion of the procedure the same across the consortium.
  - viii. Where do quarantine disclaimers appear: On some Sirsi notices, on some book drops, and on some library websites. Looking for a consistent system message on the change in interpretation of the REALM study results and focusing more on airborne vs contact transmission.
  - ix. Kisten Almo: **Motion** for ALS moves to a 24-hour quarantine on book drops and delivery materials in light of new WI DHS interpretation of the REALM Study results. Libraries will do so at their earliest convenience.
  - x. Second: Maribeth Miller
  - xi. Vote: Unanimously approved
- b. Recollection WI call for stories

- i. Steve Platter forwarded an email.
- ii. ALS has two kits for those who are interested. MPL has worked with Milton College and EFPL is working on Evansville Seminary materials.
- c. LAWDS yard signs and window clings
  - i. Steve Platteter sent out email last week and placed order for the yard signs and window clings. Paid for by a grant that was initially meant to provide training to libraries.
  - ii. Libraries have already received posters.
  - iii. Some materials will be in Spanish as well.

  - iii. LSTA mini-grants will be available at some point for Marketing Plan development assistance using our template
- c. Library Shorts Statistics October: 79 Views (Sensory Bins 6; Falling for Words 3; Music Shakers 17; Kandinsky Tree 13; Capillary Action 14; Candy Corn Math 26)
- d. Have been experimenting with AT&T's Bluejeans video conferencing app. Not overly please with it. LLS is sharing a Go-To- Meeting meeting room with ALS. Steve Platteter is looking at holding virtual office hours/drop in meeting weekly. On Wednesdays at 9:30 a.m.
- e. Steve Platteter forwarded a WI Project Recovery email. Sent out materials, would like to talk at a future ALS Librarians Meeting.
- f. Some of the libraries are interested in NOT continuing their SWANK Movie Licensing. Their outdoor movie license is available through Q2 for free with an additional form. There is a virtual license for an additional fee. Might be able to push the license forward if you havne't been using it. Sounds like the rep is pretty flexible. (Jim Novy manages Lakeshores License, his rep is MJ Malik)

### 7. Activities in Member Libraries

- a. **Hedberg Public Library** Annual Night at the Library Fundraiser was cancelled due to COVID concerns. Drive-in Movie is in good shape for next week. HVAC project should be done second week in November. Still working on lighting issues from the Transformation project. Anticipating 2022 budget to be significantly different.
- b. **Edgerton Public Library** Still working on their HVAC project. Attempting a book sale next month. Food for Fines in November. Next month, EPL board will discuss potentially becoming totally fine free. Doing packet programming, no in-person.

- Waiting for public comment and approval of budget. Will be doing some building maintenance projects.
- c. **Beloit Public Library** City Budget is moving forward submitting based on normal times since state hasn't said anything different. Doing in-person programming like before COVID but on a limited capacity scale.
- d. **Eager Free Public Library** Budget submitted. Evansville has a referendum for the pool coming up. City administrator is leaving, looking into doing a wage study. Friends normally have a pie sale before Thanksgiving, they've cancelled it for this year—hoping to do a winter book sale. Sticking with virtual programs and take home kits for the winter.
- e. **Clinton Public Library** Will be open all day, eliminating closed for cleaning times. Also opening book drop for longer. Budget process is stalled, last meeting was postponed while waiting for COVID results. Board is meeting to review the 4 applications for the Director position.
- f. Orfordville Public Library 5% budget cut across the board, village employees got a 2% raise. There's a chance library might get the 5% back. Doing a 20-minute inperson story time, it's usually 3 kids and 3 adults, they take a craft home, wear masks and socially distance. Started an Adult Craft like EFPL does, and it's been very popular. Ongoing book sale has been going well. Fan of the fine free idea, reduced fine line in next year budgets. Been taking overdue fines off during COVID. OPL is open it's normal hours, steady visits.
- g. **Milton Public Library** Budget is flat. City employees getting a 1% raise. Fully staffed and their settling in great. Doing a grab bag book sale on a genre or subject for \$5. Friends group has restarted, it's growing slowly. Working on Strategic Plan. City finished their strategic plan. Virtual programs through the end of the year, probably the beginning of next too. Having fun making videos.



Presenter: Dipesh Navsaria

Title and Description Coming Soon: How the virus is putting scientific discovery on display – how things change with new data, and how librarians can help people understand and not lose faith in science, and encourage reliable information-seeking.

Dipesh Navsaria, MPH, MSLIS, MD is a pediatrician working in the public interest. He blends the roles of physician, occasional children's librarian, educator, public health professional and child health advocate.

An associate professor of pediatrics at the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health and is director of the MD–MPH program there as well as the medical director of the physician assistant program. Clinically, he has practiced primary care pediatrics, with special interest in underserved populations. He is the founding medical director of Reach Out and Read Wisconsin.

Committed to understanding how basic science can translate into busy primary-care settings via population health concepts and policy initiatives, Dr Navsaria aims to educate the next generation of those who work with children and families in realizing how their professional roles include being involved in larger concepts of social policy and how they may affect the cognitive and socioemotional development of children for their future benefit.

The Wake County (North Carolina) Public Library System has made decreasing barriers to library use a priority in their strategic and tactical planning. This session will explore common barriers including unnecessary or restrictive policies, difficulties of accessing library facilities, lack of service awareness, and insufficient literacies. Learn how the library has worked to combat the impact of these barriers by systematically reviewing and updating library policies and operational practices and by responding to customer needs within their community.

Ann Burlingame is Deputy Director of the Wake County Public Library System (WCPL). Ann received ALA's 2015 Peggy Sullivan Award for Public Library Administrators Supporting Services to Children. Under Ann's leadership the Every Family Ready to Achieve initiative was implemented in WCPL which focused on removing barriers to service for vulnerable populations. This initiative included the ABC Craft and Learn program which simulates a Pre-Kindergarten classroom and supports a child's smooth launch to kindergarten.

Katrina is the Senior Library Manager for Facilities and Operations at Wake County Public Library System (WCPL). She analyzes data trends to determine areas of growth for the library system, and oversees new building projects and both major and minor renovations for WCPL. Katrina evaluates user experience within the library system's 24 facilities and works to ensure that WCPL's libraries are inviting, comfortable, and safe places.

Sarah is a lifelong library user, with over fifteen years of experience working in special and public libraries. In her current role as Manager for Customer Experience, she manages Youth Services Programming for the library system and oversees locations dedicated to serving vulnerable

populations. Sarah's passions are early literacy, customer service, and connecting citizens to programs and resources that enrich their lives.

### Staying True to Yourself in Times of Stress

Closing Session: Staying True to Yourself in Times of Stress Presented by: Beck Tench In this talk, we will look to academic scholarship, ancient wisdom traditions, and personal creative practices for strategies that help us stay true to ourselves in times of stress. In particular, we will look for practices that help us accept, and even embrace, discomfort, messiness, and vulnerability in our lives and work.

Beck Tench is a wife, daughter, friend, teacher, gardener, cyclist, kind stranger, and PhD student at the University of Washington Information School. She researches how the design of physical and digital spaces cultivates contemplative experience and practice.

She was formally trained as a designer at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and spent her career before returning to academia helping museums, libraries, and non-profits embrace risk-taking, creativity, and change through technology and personal space-making. Her work from that time was mentioned in the New York Times, National Public Radio, Scientific American, and several books and blogs.
