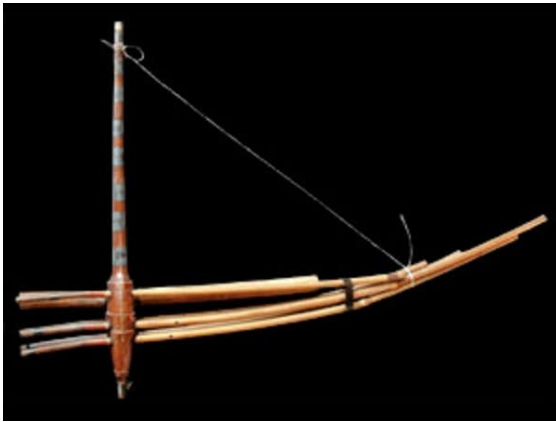


## Listen and Draw

The Geej (pronounced GHLENG) is an L-shaped configuration of bamboo pipes. Some people say the Geej is the Hmong equivalent of the Scottish bagpipes, minus the bags. The instrument has a sacred role in Hmong culture.

# RECYLCED BOTTLE SUN CATCHERS

## SUPPLIES

- plastic water bottles
- permanent markers
- yarn, fishing line, or string
- ruler
- scissors

## INSTRUCTIONS

1. Remove labels from bottles
2. Color the bottles - be creative
3. Cut the bottom from the bottles
4. Cut at a diagonal starting at the bottom and keep cutting to the dome near the top of the bottle.
5. Measure and cut the yarn/fishing line/string to 36 inches.
6. Bring the yarn around the neck of the bottle keeping the ends even tie a knot.
7. Bring the ends together and tie a knot
8. Make a bunch and hang inside or outside. Enjoy!
